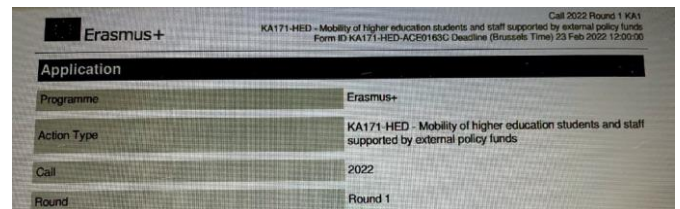


THEME 1 – Social issue – contemporary challenges in public policies

Between November 23 and December 5, Professor Professor Maria Lúcia Teixeira Garcia carried out a work mission at the University of Humak (Finland) with the objective of signing a cooperation agreement and identifying public notices for the submission of joint research proposals.

With meetings with the rector and administrative sectors, the mission provided: signing of a cooperation agreement (available on UFES's International Office website), joint submission of a proposal to the Erasmus+ public notice (finished in February 2022), and beginning of discussion for a joint proposal for the Capacity Building public notice. In addition, other partnerships between courses at

Ufes and Humak are being raised by other departments.

In February, it was Professor Maria Lúcia's turn to carry out a work mission at Robert Gordon University (Aberdeen, Scotland). The activities involved meetings with the rectory and the department responsible for co-tutorship (cotutelle) and double degrees, classes with students from the Social Work course, meeting with colleagues from the Departments of Social Service, Public Health, and

Architecture, in addition to meetings with the sector responsible for public notices and cooperations.

The activities were fruitful and the arrangements for cotutelle were successful. The agenda for new meetings and the signing of agreements for those are ongoing.
